Enough Is Enough!

On Sunday 25th October 2009, 22 year old gay trainee police officer James Parkes was the victim of a brutal homophobic attack on Stanley Street in the heart of Liverpool's gay quarter. The attack left Mr Parkes with multiple skull fractures, a fractured eye socket and a fractured cheek bone. On Tuesday 13th October 2009, Ian Baynham, 62, died as a result of the fatal head injuries he sustained after a homophobic attack in Trafalgar Square in September.

North West charity The Lesbian and Gay Foundation (LGF), along with Liverpool's Armistead Centre and Merseyside Police are distributing copies of their new pocket sized personal safety resource for LGB&T people - "Enough is Enough! Say no to homophobic hate crime". The resource includes practical tips on personal safety, information on how you report a hate crime and LGB&T organisations that act as third party hate crime reporting centres.

Always look for a Registered Charity Number on such leaflets, and to guarantee your donation is going to a good cause, take your items directly to a local charity shop.

If in doubt, it may also be worth contacting the City Council to see if a company is licensed to collect in the area.

Future Jobs Fund

Across the District, Third Sector organisations including social enterprises and charities have access to the Future Jobs Fund by creating vacancies within their organisation (qualifying jobs should last at least six months, and offer at least 25 hours of work per week), which will be funded by the government for six months.

The fund is aimed at getting 18 to 24 year olds (all ages in unemployment hotspots) back into employment.

The benefits for your organisation are;

- Growth – additional staff will allow you to achieve more
- Funding – all posts are fully funded for 6 months. After that, you may be able to offer a more substantive contract
- Development – bring new people into the Third Sector giving it a stronger presence
- Training – bring new skills to young people and give them hope for the future.
- Help – to reduce long term unemployment and prevent a “lost generation” of alienated young people.

In most cases, eligible candidates will be referred to employers by Jobcentre Plus. In some cases individuals may self-present to the employer, or may be identified by them directly. In these situations, Jobcentre Plus will need to confirm an individual’s eligibility. Future Jobs Fund employers will be encouraged to sign a Local Employment Partnership (LEP) with Jobcentre Plus.

Future Jobs Fund employers will not be required to take on any particular individual who is referred to them but will be expected to give reasons if they decline to take someone on and to provide feedback on what the individual could have done to be successful in their application.

Drinkaware

The Drinkaware grants scheme aims to change the UK's drinking culture for the better. They work to positively influence public behaviour and find innovative ways to raise awareness about the effects of alcohol, to help reduce alcohol misuse and minimise alcohol related harm.

Grants are available to groups in any part of the UK, working with any population group, through three schemes:

Ideas Fund (up to £2,000)

Ideal for community-based projects needing support to work out an initial idea before applying for a larger award. Or it could be put to good use on development work by organisations looking to scope out a larger alcohol awareness or education initiative.

Awareness Projects (up to £25,000)

This scheme offers the funds you need to deliver messages which raise awareness about alcohol misuse and bring about tangible change. They are looking for projects that undertake direct, hands-on work with individuals and the community.

Big Impact Awards (up to £100,000)

This is designed to help larger scale projects pack a more powerful punch or reach a wider audience. Proposals need to show how an organisation's work has impact, and how it contributes to learning about alcohol awareness and education.

The Trust gives grants that allow disadvantaged young people to take up opportunities to experience the great outdoors, and usually supports programmes run by schools or youth groups. The Trust is more likely to support groups representing those who are disadvantaged or who face particular challenges. They do support programs that simply introduce young people to the outdoors, but prefer to fund schools and groups that offer a continuing opportunity for young people to deepen their experience.

The Trust does not have an application form but you must read the guidelines and send a proposal.

The Britannia Foundation is a registered charity that offers grants and donations between £1,000 and £25,000 to registered charities and schools working within education, particularly numeracy and/or financial literacy.

The Foundation prefers buying specific items of equipment but in some circumstances will consider capital expenditure and salary costs.

'v' is an independent charity set up to inspire a new generation of young volunteers (aged 16-25) in England and to enable lasting change in the quality, quantity and diversity of youth volunteering activities.

The charity's aim is to create a culture where it is natural for young people to volunteer, and natural for organisations to support them in doing so. The 'v' Match Fund grants programme aims to inspire greater levels of investment in youth volunteering from private companies, charitable trusts and foundations and individuals.

The programme will match any amount between £10,000 and £250,000.

Small Charity Constitution

The Charity Commission has published a simplified model constitution for charities below the registration threshold.

This constitution is specifically designed for charities which expect to stay small, and have an annual income under £5,000. It is not meant for charities that own a building, employ people or intend to register with the Charity Commission. Small groups which are not charities are also welcome to use this model constitution, though they would not be covered by charity law.
